Message from our Superintendent Minister Mark Roberts

A little bit of rural history has come to the circuit- the Golden Plough has arrived! Many of you will know we had to empty Helen's mum's house a year ago when she moved into a home. As part of this we have inherited the archives of Helen's late Father Les. Les has a certain fame in the county of Herefordshire, where he is remembered as Britain's first world ploughing champion. He won the world championships in Stuttgart in 1958 and got to keep a small replica of the Golden Plough, the winner's trophy.

Competitive ploughing is still very much a part of rural life, showing ploughing's continued importance in agriculture. It is essential for the successful growth of many crops. It aerates the soil, it brings fresh nutrients to the surface and it helps to control weeds. Although the equipment has changed a bit, plough men and women have been tilling the ground for at least 5,000 years. In the Bible we learn that the prophet Elisha amongst

others was a ploughman, walking behind his team oxen when Elijah arrived to anoint him as his successor.

The plough has something to teach us in the times when everything seems to be turned on its head. The earth is disturbed, but that provides the conditions for growth. In this little part of the Church, it has felt like things have been turned on their heads on a regular basis over the past few years, and yet there is still growth. I think this is in part because things have been disturbed. We have had to discover new ways and new possibilities. Things we might never have done otherwise have proved a success. It's not been easy. There are times where I have felt very stretched, and I know many of you have as well. And yet God has worked through us. Every time we get together as a circuit, we hear stories of growth and lives being transformed by Christ's love.

All being well, in September we will be back to three ministers. The competitive ploughing season will be starting, but maybe the ploughing season in the circuit will be over (for a period at least!). I'm excited to see what might happen then, and I hope you are too.
